The Town Board of the Town of Dayton, Waupaca County, Wisconsin, by this resolution, adopted by a majority of the town board on a roll call vote with a quorum present and voting and proper notice having been given, resolves and orders as follows:

Whereas the Town of Dayton adopted ordinance 46 incorporating the authority the Town Board has to designate areas of the town as NO PARKING in the procedure established in Wi. Stats. 349.13 and Town of Dayton Ordinance 46;

And whereas the Town of Dayton has determined on the basis of an investigation that parking vehicles in certain areas of the town may cause hazards to persons and vehicles;

Therefore the Town of Dayton hereby resolves to declare the following areas as NO PARKING of motor vehicles on the improved portion of any roadway within the Town of Dayton at any time.

And Therefore the Town of Dayton hereby resolves to declare the following areas as NO PARKING of motor vehicles on town road highways or public right-of-ways. There shall be no parking on the improved portion of any roadway within the Town of Dayton at any time

When appropriate signs giving notice of such NO PARKING have been erected and are in place in locations listed below, such no parking areas shall be effective at all times or at such times as indicated by the signs.

- 1. Butternut Road from intersection of Long Cove Road South 1300 feet
- 2. Cleghorn Road from the north town line to State Road 22
- 3. County Road K from Danielson Road to Barnhart Road
- 4. Crystal Road from County Road K southbound to Danielson Road
- 5. Emmons Creek Road from West Road to E574 Emmons Creek Road
- 6. Knight Lane from north town line to Knight Lane Bridge
- 7. Long Cove Road from Camp Road to Cleghorn Road
- 8. Marl Lake Road (access) from the water's edge to Whispering Pines Road
- 9. Parfreyville Road from N2097 Parfreyville Road to N 2123 Parfreyville Road
- 10. Snug Harbor Road from Cleghorn Road to the end of the road
- 11. Radley Road from E1061 Radley Road to E1165 Radley Road
- 12. Rural Road from Ashmun Road to Main Street
- 13. Rural Road from Emmons Creek Road to E995 Rural Road
- 14. Rural Road from E737 Rural Road to West Road
- 15. Rural Road from 200' south of Pope Lake Access Trail to 200' north of Hartman Creek
- 16. West Miner Drive from Cleghorn Road to the North town line.
- 17. West Spencer Lake Road N1465 West Spencer Lake Road to the water's edge.
- 18. Whispering Pines Road from Rural Road to the north town line.

And whereas the Town of Dayton has authority under Wis. Stats. 349.13(1k)(a)(a), with respect to highways under its jurisdiction, may authorize persons whose residences abut a highway in a zone where parking is prohibited by official signs, guests of such persons, and commercial enterprises providing services to such persons to park their vehicles in the highway zone without regard to the posted prohibitions.

Therefore the Town of Dayton does authorize that persons whose residences abut the following town road in a zone where parking is prohibited by official signs to apply for a permit to park in the town road right of way, to include guests of such persons, and commercial enterprises providing services to such persons to park their vehicles in the highway zone without regard to the posted prohibitions:

West Spencer Lake Road (Northbound) from the water's edge to N1465 West Spencer Lake Road.

And whereas the Town of Dayton has authority under Wis. Stats. 349.13(1m) (1m), with respect to highways under their jurisdiction including connecting highways within corporate limits and parking facilities within corporate limits, may, by official traffic signs indicating the restriction, prohibit parking, stopping or standing upon any portion of a street, highway or parking facility reserved for any vehicle bearing special registration plates issued under s. 341.14 (1), (1a), (1e), (1m), or (1q) or a motor vehicle, other than a motorcycle, upon which a special identification card issued under s. 343.51 is displayed or any vehicle registered in another jurisdiction and displaying a registration plate, card or emblem issued by the other jurisdiction which designates the vehicle as a vehicle used by a physically disabled person.

Therefore the Town of Dayton; with respect to highways under its jurisdiction including connecting highways within corporate limits and parking facilities within corporate limits, does restrict parking by posting official traffic signs indicating the restriction, prohibit parking, stopping or standing upon any portion of a street, highway or parking facility reserved for any vehicle bearing special registration plates issued under s. 341.14 (1), (1a), (1e), (1m), or (1q) or a motor vehicle, other than a motorcycle, upon which a special identification card issued under s. 343.51 is displayed or any vehicle registered in another jurisdiction and displaying a registration plate, card or emblem issued by the other jurisdiction which designates the vehicle as a vehicle used by a physically disabled person.

And whereas the Town of Dayton has authority under Wis. Stats. 346.55(4) (4) , with respect to highways under their jurisdiction and parking facilities within corporate limits, to, by official traffic signs indicating the restriction, prohibit parking, stopping or standing upon any portion of a street, highway or parking facility reserved for any vehicle.

Therefore the Town of Dayton does designate the following area as restricted to official, governmental, and maintenance vehicles authorized by the Town of Dayton:

Long Cove Road (eastbound) between Butternut Road and Cleghorn Road.

FORFEITURES FOR PARKING VIOLATIONS.

<u>Forfeitures For Uniform State-Wide Parking, Stopping and Standing Offenses</u>. Minimum and maximum forfeitures for violation of the offenses described in §§346.51 to 346.55, Wis. Stats., adopted by reference in chapter 46 of the Town of Dayton Municipal Code, shall be as follows:

346.56(4)	Parking in a space for physically disabled person without permit	\$50.00	\$300.00

And whereas this is a complete revision of NO PARKING areas, and all other no parking areas are declared to be repealed as of this date. This ordinance will be effective at the time the Town of Dayton has posted these locations.

The town clerk shall properly post this resolution as required under s. 60.80, Wis. stats.
