Parks and Recreation Director - September Report

Administrative:

- We received great news on a few of the grants that were applied for from the DNR. As a reminder we applied for two Recreation Trail Program grants for projects at Swan Park and Waupaca Eco Park on the River Ridge Trail. Staff also applied for a Land and Water Conservation Fund grant for the proposed Swan Park Playground and Splash Pad project. I recently received tentative aware letters for all three projects and all three will be fully or partially funded. The RTP grants are 50% matching grants and both were fully funded at \$9,500 for Swan Park and \$36,184 for Waupaca Eco Park. We have also received grant dollars from the Greenways Commission and Community Foundation of \$7,300 and \$7,500 respectively. The LWCF grant was also a 50% matching grant and we applied for around \$650,000 for the Swan Park project. Though we were not fully funded we are extremely excited that we tentatively have been awarded \$334,464. I can't thank our shared grant writer, Greg Grohman, and the Friends of Waupaca parks for their help and support to secure this funding!
- The Bicycle and Pedestrian plan is moving forward with gathering more data of how our current trails/walkways are being used. This past week employees from East Central Planning came out to Waupaca to set up 10 different infrared sensors. These sensors will measure both walking and biking activity at the locations. Some of these are based on looking at possible future needs and some are to judge which current areas get the most use. I have attached a map of the location of the sensors and a picture of what they look like. They should be left up for around 2-3 weeks to gather information.



- We are now up to four groups participating in the newly created Adopt-a-Trail program. The purpose of
 this program was to receive help from community groups who are interested in helping with general
 maintenance of the River Ridge Trail. I recently met with one of the groups to look over what they have
 done and ideas of other tasks to help out. The trail looked great and it's nice to see community
 members taking some ownership of the trail system. I think the program has been successful and look
 to grow the program in the future.
- Once again our annual Fall-O-Rama was held on September 18th at Upper South Park. This craft fair
 event is a fundraiser for the Friends of Waupaca Parks and is a great community event. This year we had
 around 50 vendors and also had some coordination with the Rural Historical Society House Tour to help

promote their event. Overall it was a great event and many community members came out to enjoy a beautiful day.

Parks:

- After another busy season our park shelters will be closed on October 1st, 2021. People may always continue to use the parks but bathrooms will be closed and rentals will be done for the year. It was nice to see park shelter rentals return to normal numbers after last summer.
- Parks and cemetery crews will be focusing on mowing, leaves and closing down parks for the next few
 weeks. Water lines will be taken care of and everything sealed up for the season. Some of our part time
 parks crew staff will still be helping out on the weekend to keep up with mowing and picking up leaves.

They joined our party back in 2019, and I am happy to be bringing them back to the community for another show! We look forward to making this a fun and memorable event again.

Parks Crew and Lifeguard Seasonal Wage Scale Update

For 2022, staff is proposing an update to our wage scales for our seasonal parks crew and lifeguarding positions. The pay scale for these positions was last reviewed in 2016 for the 2017 season. With the amount of jobs in the community paying higher wages we have struggled in our hiring. We had multiple employees hired this year that left for a higher paying job in the community. Our goal is to always hire the best possible employees to keep the high standard we have set for our parks and beach. For us to stay competitive in hiring the best possible employees, we feel it is important to adjust these scales.

Below are the current wage scales for both parks crew and lifeguards that were approved for the 2017 season.

The adjustments below will not affect the amount requested for the Youth Program Fund. As a reminder only 10% of the Lifeguards PT Wages and 80% of the Parks Crew PT Wages come from the Youth Program Fund. Staff researched both parks crew and lifeguard hours over the past few years, minus 2020 due to COVID, to see how these changes may affect these line items. We feel like these can be covered with current operational budgets. We have seen savings in other line items, for example electrical savings from installed LED lights or other operational changes, which can be shifted to make up the difference.
